

Description Advanced level qualifications (known as A levels) are subject-based qualifications that can lead to university, further study, training, or work. You can normally study three or more A levels over two years. They're usually assessed by a series of examinations

Spotlight

A **Curriculum Vitae**, commonly referred to as a CV, is a short, written summary of your skills, achievements and experience which relate to a role you want. You use it in the first stage of applying for jobs.

The first thing you need when writing a good CV is to make sure you know your goal. You need to write your CV with the job in mind. The right CV will get you an interview quickly, but a badly written CV may mean you don't even get a rejection, you just never hear about the role again.

What are apprenticeships?

An apprenticeship is a paid job where the employee learns and gains valuable experiences.

Alongside on-the-job training, apprentices spend at least 20% of their working hours completing classroom-based learning with a college, university or training provider which leads to a nationally recognised qualification.


