In school across every subject, we are encouraging students to 'sound like an expert' by using their speaking and listening skills and key vocabulary - another way for our students to earn rewards.









Christmas recipe

Why not make snowy crackle chocolate biscuits during the Christmas holidays? Don't forget to ask permission from an adult first - maybe you could even bake together!?

What you'll need:

- 200g dark chocolate, chopped
- 125g unsalted butter, softened
- 300g soft light brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 150g plain flour
- 60g cocoa powder
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 2-3 tbsp milk
- 100g icing sugar



Method

step 1 - Melt the chocolate in a bowl set over a pan of barely simmering water (make sure the base doesn't touch the water), or in a microwave in short bursts. Set aside to cool.

STEP 2 - Beat the butter and sugar together, then beat in the eggs, flour, cocoa powder, baking powder and chocolate. Pour in the milk to make a soft dough, but don't overmix it! Cover and chill for 1 hr.

gas 4. Line one or two baking sheets with parchment. Put the icing sugar in a bowl. Scoop heaped tablespoons of dough and roll each ball in your hands before dropping it into the icing sugar and rolling it around. Put on baking sheets and repeat, spacing the balls apart.

step 4 - Bake for about 12-15 mins until the biscuits feel firm when touched. The biscuits should puff up and cracks should open up, too. Leave to cool on the trays, then transfer to wire racks to cool completely. They will keep up to a week in an airtight container.

Our Book Club also began this term where the group are currently reading Malamander by Thomas Taylor. Our 12 days of Christmas also gave an opportunity for students to win some new reads. Each form group nominated two kind students to win a Christmas book!
