Launch of EASI – Easy Access to Systems and Information

EASI is an online place to check important day-to-day school information. It acts like an online planner and allows you to:

Check what **homework** you have and when it's due (there is will be a link to all instructions in Microsoft Teams) - see your **attendance percentage** - see how many **positive behaviour points** you have earned - see your **detentions** - open **emails** - **access Student Pod** & external learning websites (such as Quizlet/Seneca Learning) - open all **Office 365** programs, such as PowerPoint, Word, Teams and OneDrive - COMING SOON: Access the Rewards Points Shop

The login link is at the top right of the school website. Parents/carers can access EASI using their child's login details. A full user guide was emailed earlier in the term but if you would like any help on how to use EASI, please contact your child's progress leader: Year 7 Mrs Sands, Year 8 & 9 Mr Norminton, and Year 10 & 11 Mr Stockwell.
