1. Introduction

Rye Hills Academy is part of the North East Learning Trust and the uniform policy supports the high standards of the Trust and the Academy. At Rye Hills Academy we believe that a school uniform plays an important role in creating a focused and respectful learning environment. Our uniform policy is designed to promote equality, reduce distractions, and instill a sense of pride and belonging among students. By wearing the correct uniform, students represent not only themselves but also the values and community of our school. This policy outlines the expectations for student dress and appearance, ensuring consistency and clarity for all members of the school community.

2. Aims

We believe that a clearly defined Academy uniform is important because it:

Promotes Equality

To create a sense of fairness and reduce peer pressure by minimising visible economic and social differences among students.

• Encourages a Sense of Belonging

To help students feel part of the school community and take pride in representing their school.

• Supports a Focused Learning Environment

To reduce distractions and support a professional atmosphere that is conducive to learning and achievement.

Enhances Safety and Security

To ensure students are easily identifiable as members of the school, both on-site and during off-site activities, improving overall safety.

Fosters Discipline and Responsibility

To encourage students to take responsibility for their appearance and to understand the importance of following guidelines and expectations.

• Prepares Students for the Future

To help students develop habits of personal presentation that are important in many workplaces and formal environments.

3. School Uniform

The school uniform requirements are outlined in the table below, along with details regarding which items are optional and which need to be branded.

Trousers	Required	Plain grey formal straight cut school trousers – not leggings, jeans or stretch style. The bottoms of the trouser must be at least 7.5 inches/18 cm wide at the bottom. Note: Trousers purchased elsewhere MUST be the same style and fit as those provided by the uniform supplier.
Skirt	Required	Plain grey pleated or straight pencil skirt. Not tight fitting or stretch material and must be no more than one inch above the knee. Note: Skirts purchased from elsewhere MUST be the same as available from the uniform supplier.
Socks/Tights	Required	Socks must be black. Plain grey opaque tights must be worn with skirts. Note: Can be purchased from any high-street retailer.
Shoes	Required	Plain black, formal, leather or leather look shoes which can be polished. No trainers, plimsolls or boots. Note: Shoes can be purchased from any high-street retailer.
Academy House Badges	Required	Note: House badges to be worn on the lapel of the blazer. Supplied by school.

General Appearance

General Appearance	
Hair	Hair should be a natural colour (one colour only). The Academy reserves the right to decide that the cut and colour of a student's hair is inappropriate. Tramlines, Mohicans, extreme short sides, longer on top are examples of styles that are deemed inappropriate. Hair bands should be thin and not overly decorated e.g., no larger flowers.
Religious Head	Students may wear religious head coverings or garments (e.g.
Coverings	hijabs, turbans, kippahs) as part of their uniform, provided they are plain black or navy.
Jewellery	Students are allowed to wear one small, plain stud in each earlobe. No other jewellery (this includes necklaces, bracelets and/or rings) or visible body piercings are permitted. Clear plastic jewellery is not allowed in non-permitted piercings and students will not be allowed to cover piercings with plasters. Parents must ensure that if a child is to have any additional piercings this must take place at the start of the six weeks' holiday and jewellery removed on the first day of the Autumn term.
Make-Up	Students can wear discreet, natural make-up. The Academy reserves the right to decide whether the amount of make-up a student is applying is inappropriate. Students are not permitted to wear false, gel or acrylic nails and/or coloured nail varnish. For health and safety reasons nails need to be a sensible length. False eyelashes are not permitted. Fake tan, like make-up, needs to be discreet.
Tattoos	Tattoos, including Henna, which are visible are not permitted. It is illegal to have a tattoo below the age of 18.
Clothing	Large fashion belts are not part of the Academy uniform. Small, plain black belts may be worn.

	Hoods must not be worn inside the Academy.	
Equipment	All students are expected to come to the Academy with: • a bag large enough to carry an A4 file (backpacks are recommended) • a pencil case containing pen, pencil, ruler, and a rubber	
	Tutors and Year Managers will carry out equipment checks regularly. Where a student repeatedly fails to bring the correct equipment Year Managers will contact home and then if required sanctions will be applied.	

The Academy reserves the right to make the final decision on what is acceptable and what is not acceptable.

If you have any good quality uniform that your child no longer needs, including PE kit, please drop it off at the main reception. It will then be re-distributed to students when required via Student Services.

As part of the Home School Agreement our students and parents/guardians agree to conform to the uniform requirements of the school. Therefore, if parents/guardians or students are in doubt about whether or not a particular article of clothing is suitable or before making any decisions about altering hair colour or style, we ask that they contact their child's Year Manager prior to any change.
