Here at Rye Hills Academy we are constantly seeking ways to improve and enhance your child's educational experience. With this aim in mind we have organised three Activity Days which will provide your child with a range of different and exciting alternatives to the normal curriculum.

During these days, the school will be suspending lessons and will instead be offering a wide range of activities. From the timetable in this booklet you will notice that your child has a number of open choices. These sessions will last for a whole day (9am - 3pm) and the activities on offer are contained within this booklet.

Students can choose to wear non-uniform clothes for all activities. We would ask that all students dress appropriately for the activities they choose, especially those that could prove to be wet or muddy; we advise no denim jeans to be worn for this type of activity!

For every off-site activity a parent/carer must complete a parental consent form; this must be returned to **reception.**

Please note that some activities will incur a charge and all payments must be made by the deadline to secure their place. We would always encourage parents who are experiencing difficulty paying to contact us to have a conversation about how we can help.

For most off-site activities students will need a packed lunch. If your child is currently receiving Free School Meals and would like a packed lunch provided by the school, there will be a box to tick on each consent form. If the box is not ticked, a packed lunch will NOT be provided for your child and it will therefore be your responsibility to provide lunch for your child.

The completed slips should be returned to reception.

Students will also have to take responsibility for checking which activities are available to them, signing up for the activities and returning their choice form to reception as soon as possible. Students should note that there will be a limited number of places for each open choice. Where trips and activities are oversubscribed, places will be decided by a random draw.

We hope you will agree that the Activity Days have the potential to offer a stimulating and worthwhile contribution to your child's life at Rye Hills Academy.

Crafting - in School


Activities: A vast array of crafting will be on offer. Have an

Activities: Northumberland Zoo is a family-run animal not-


for-profit collection in the heart of


Walk to the Beach & Crazy Golf
